Marin Transit

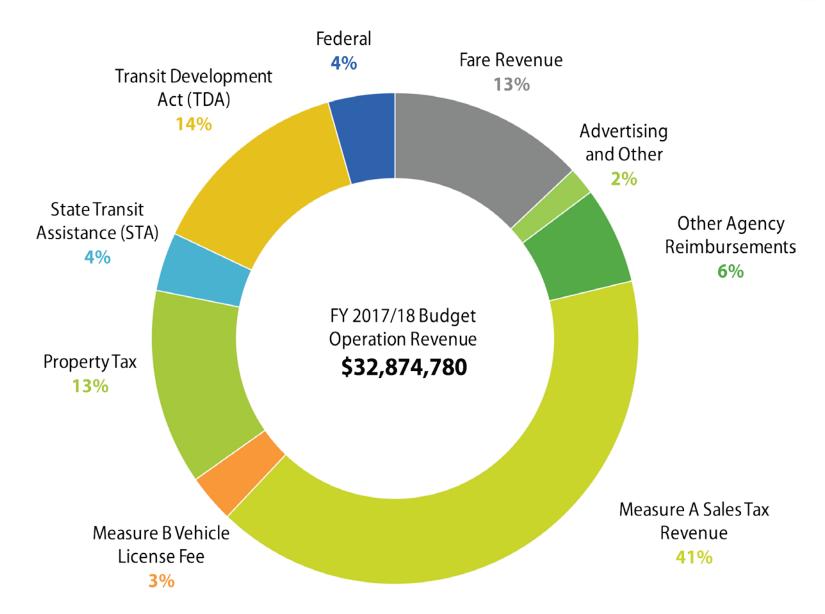


- 34% more service since 2004

- Expanded service to West Marin



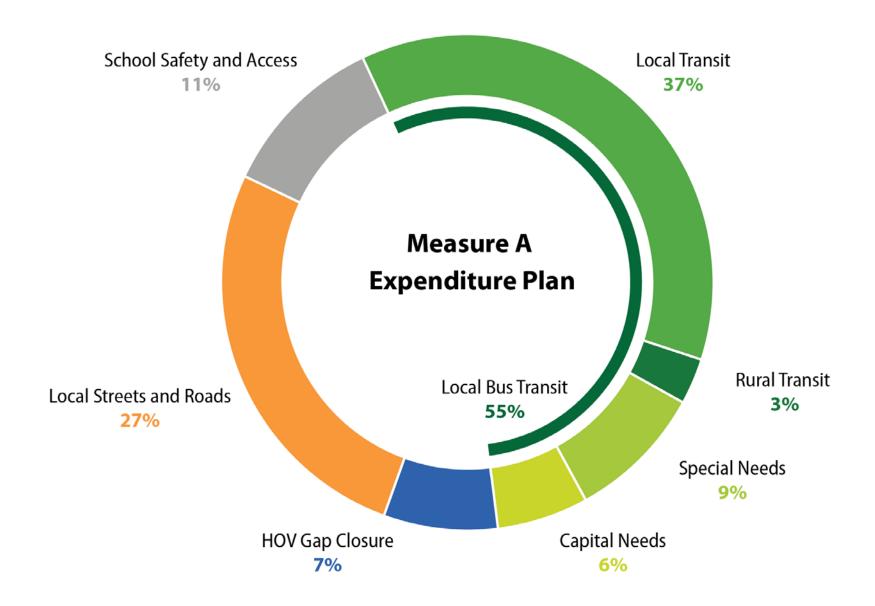
2017/18 Operations Budget Revenue

- Measure A funds 45% of local bus service

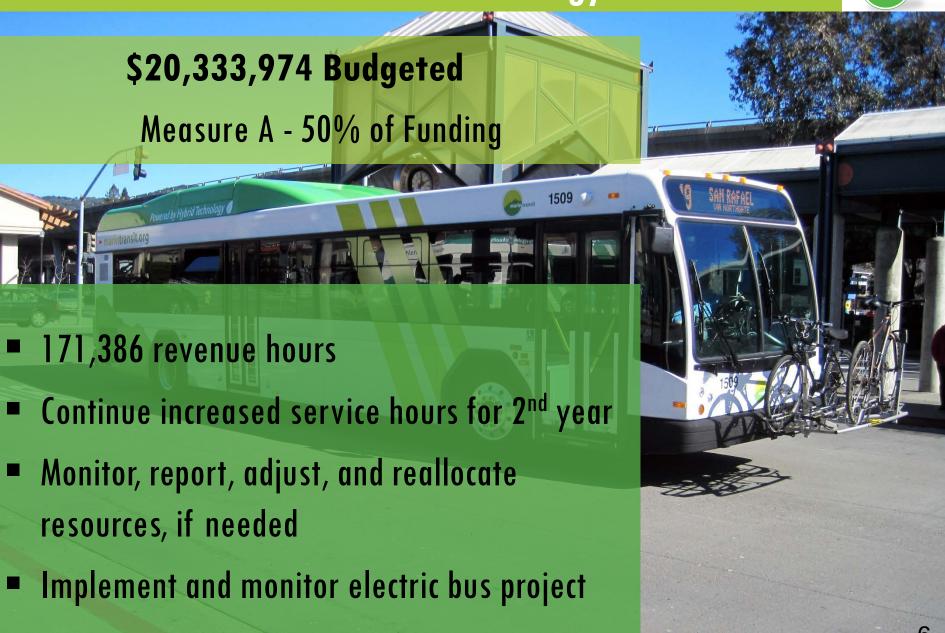






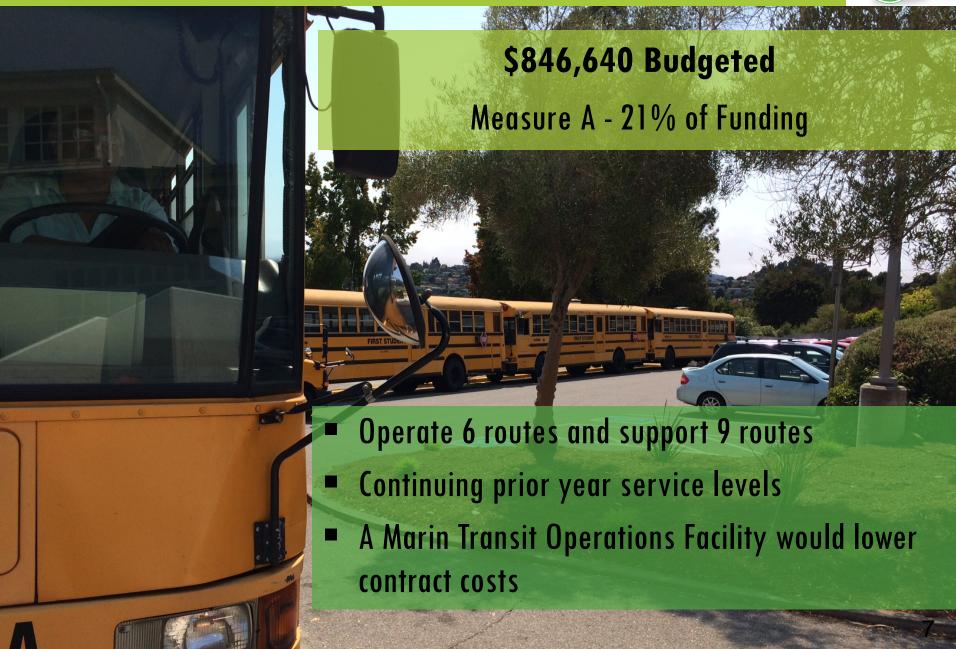

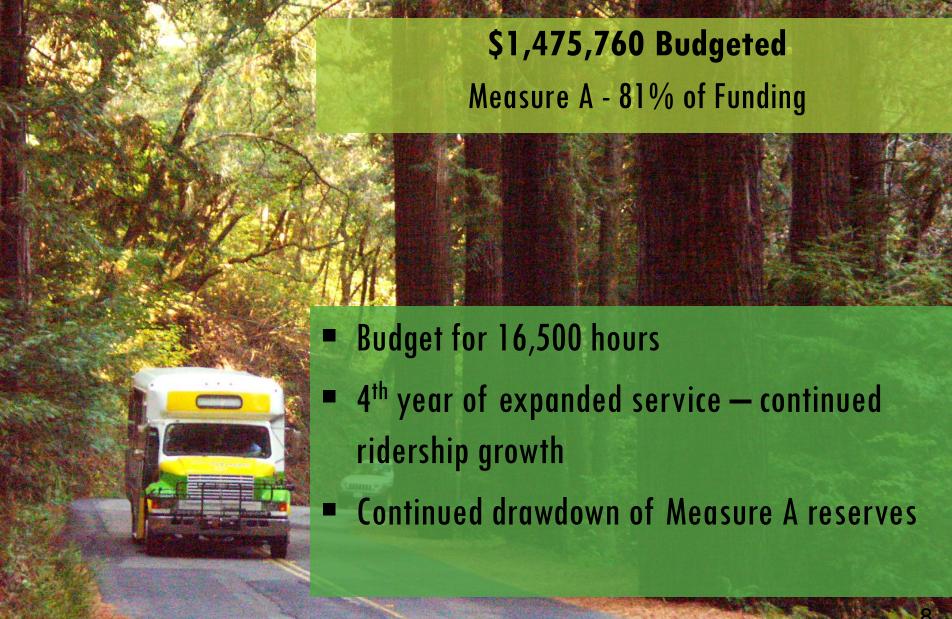
Yellow Bus- Measure A Strategy 1.1

Marin Access - Measure A Strategy 1.3





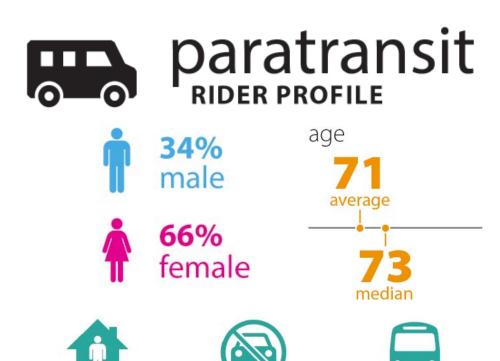
- Lower demand for mandated services than projected

 - Purchase of two accessible vans

Marin Access — Measure B



Over 9,000 residents registered as Marin Access customers

- 124,764 passenger trips on paratransit
- 16,000+ passenger trips on Catch A Ride (taxi subsidy program)
- 16,000+ volunteer driver trips supported by STAR/TRIP
- Low Income Rider Scholarships
- Travel Navigators education, travel counseling, certification, and training

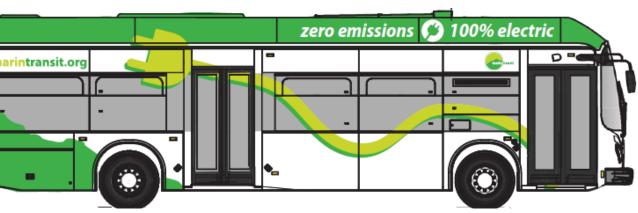

Completion of Downtown Novato Bus Stop Facility Replacement

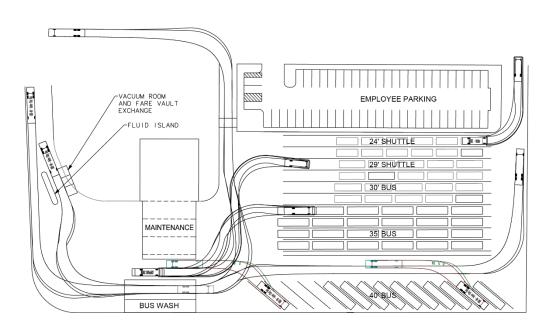


Delivery of Ten
