- Contests for students



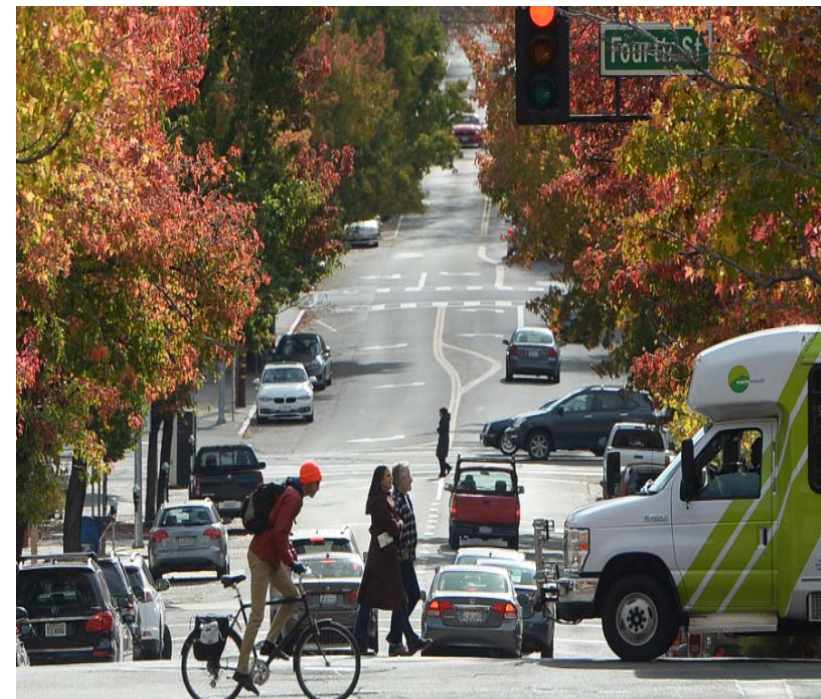
North-South Greenway Milestones

Downtown San Rafael Congestion

- TAM hosted a meeting in March to examine issues and solutions for congestion in Downtown San Rafael. Attendees included
 - San Rafael, San Anselmo, Fairfax
 - SMART, Golden Gate Transit, Marin Transit
 - Caltrans, TAM
- Considerations include
 - Traffic signal timing, train timing, traffic enforcement, pavement markings, traffic circulation

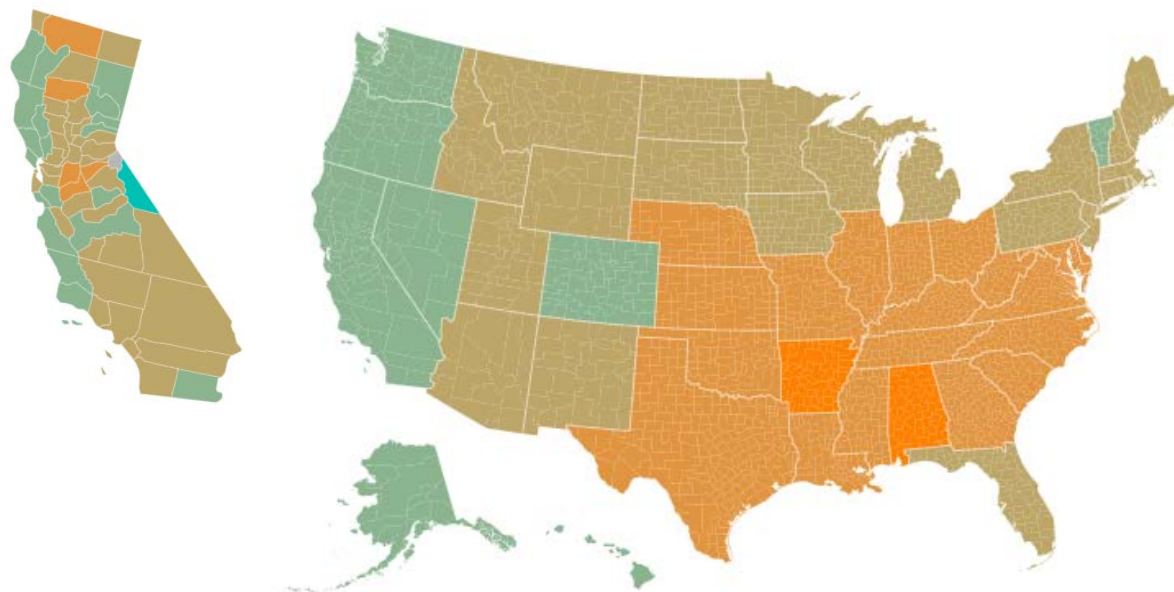

CTC to Consider Extending Deadlines

- On April 29, CTC will consider extending deadlines for SB1 programs in response to the Shelter at Home order
 - Active Transportation Program
 - Local Streets and Roads Program
 - Local Partnership Program
 - Solutions for Congested Corridors Program

(Most due dates are currently June 2020)
- On May 13, CTC will consider extending deadlines on Timely Use of Funds requirements



Senate Bill 1408 – Dodd



- On February 21, State Senator Dodd introduced legislation to create a dedicated funding source for State Route 37 improvements
 - TAM staff have been coordinating with North Bay counties to advocate for amendments
 - Due to the pandemic, the bill could be shelved and reintroduced in a future year

The Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act



Coronavirus Aid, Relief & Economic Security Act

- On March 27, the CARES act was signed into law
 - Provides an estimated \$2 trillion stimulus package to alleviate economic impacts from COVID-19 Pandemic
- Bay Area transit agencies will receive ~\$1.3 billion of ~\$25 billion for transit
 - MTC approved initial \$781 million on 4/22
