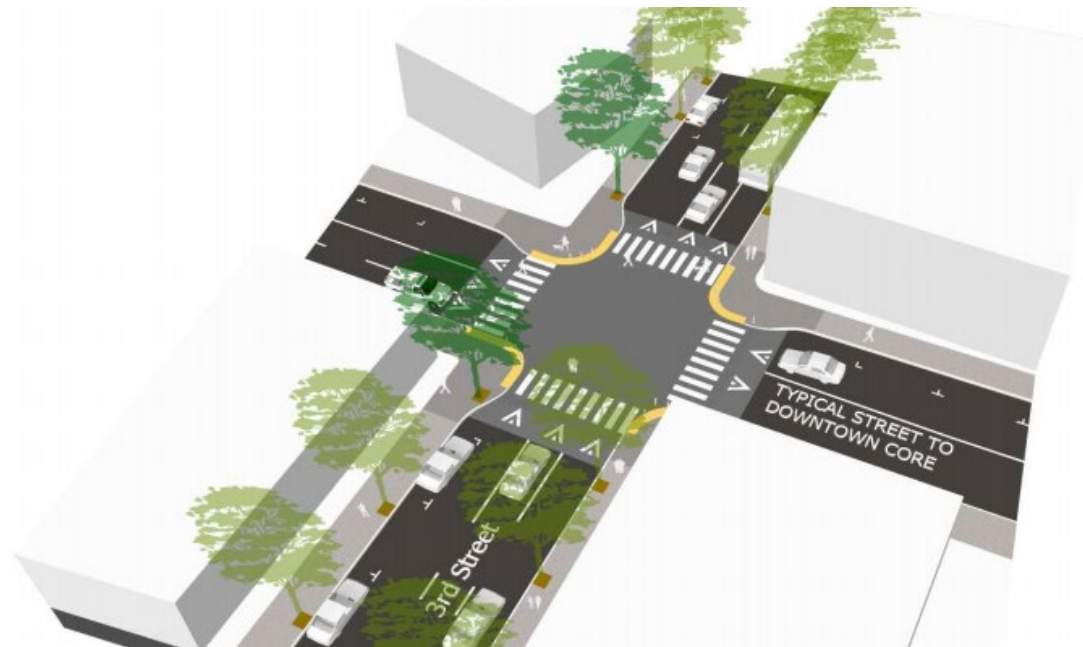
May is Bike Month

- Celebration this year is anywhere! There will not be energizer stations, but musette bags will be distributed at local bike shops



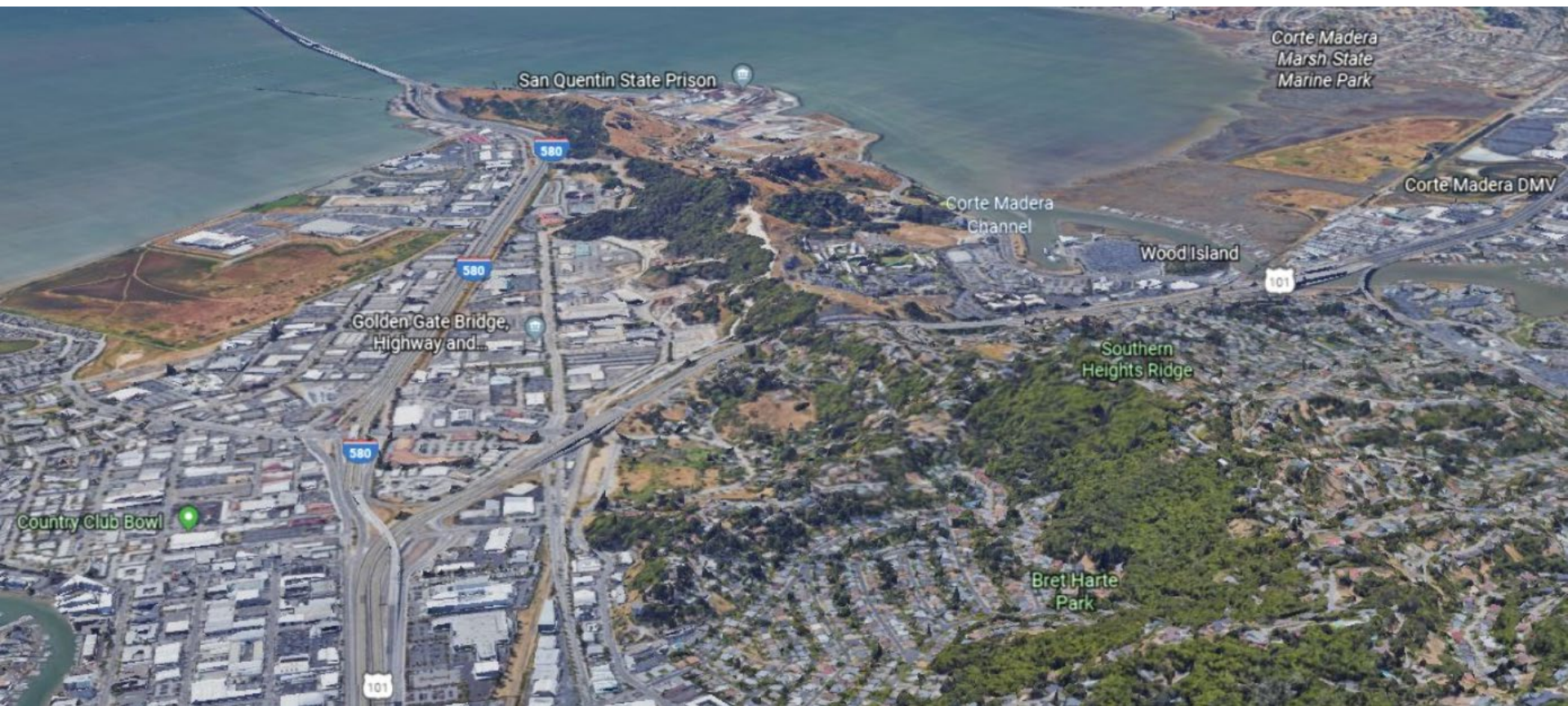
Major Roads Projects Move Forward

- San Rafael Third Street Rehabilitation Project requests \$11.6 M to begin construction
- East Blithedale Rehabilitation Project requests \$1.2 M to begin construction
- Both allocations to be considered by the TAM Board on May 27



Marin 101-580 Direct Connector

- Stakeholder Working Group meeting hosted via Zoom:
Tuesday, May 18 at 3pm – Feedback on paring down alternatives



Marin-Sonoma Narrows Funding

- In April 2021, MTC approved the programming of \$75.7 M backfill for construction of the MSN Project
- Complete funding package also includes state and local funds
- Last week, CTC approved \$3.5 million for Right-of-Way costs, completing the funding package for ROW



Transportation Fund for Clean Air (TFCA) & Transportation Development Act (TDA)

- ~ \$1.25 million available as TAM's share from FY21/22 and FY22/23
- TAM to release a Call for Projects later this month
- TFCA funds from BAAQMD for projects that reduce emissions
- TDA funds from MTC for bicycle/pedestrian projects



Congressionally Directed Funding Requests

(formerly known as earmarks)

- Congressional committees/members are accepting “community projects” requests
- Key applications submitted for consideration
 - \$1.5 m for Corte Madera Central Marin Gap Closure Project
 - \$2 m for a planning study on the San Rafael Canal Crossing
 - \$250k for TAM’s Safe Routes to Schools Street Smart Program
- TAM supported SR37 request from SCTA for \$25m for early work





San Rafael Transit Center

- On May 20, the GGBHTD Transportation committee District will consider recommending a preferred alternative
- On May 21, the GGBHTD Board will consider the recommendation for approval.
- The environmental document is expected to be released in June for public comment.

SR 37 Town Hall hosted on April 15

- California State Senators Bill Dodd and Mike McGuire hosted a Town Hall on State Route 37
- Joined by Caltrans, MTC, Judy Arnold, Anne Richman and colleagues from Sonoma, Napa and Solano
- Over 500 attendees

Plan Bay Area 2050

- At the TAM Board meeting on May 27, staff from the Metropolitan Transportation Commission will present a status update on Plan Bay Area 2050.
- The presentation will include an overview, growth geographies, projects and strategies, revenues and expenditures, key outcomes, and Implementation Plan activities.



Clipper Card App and Apple Pay

- Clipper Card regional transit fare payment now available on Apple Pay
- Allows easier, touchless boarding via iPhone and Apple Watch
- Transfer plastic card balances
- Mobile App also launched with real time transit and trip planning
