## Senate Bill 904 (Dodd)

- Signed by Governor Newsom on September 28, 2024
- Updated SMART's Enabling Legislation
  - Increased procurement bidding threshold for supplies, materials, and equipment from \$40K to \$75K
  - Removed restriction for SMART facilities in unincorporated areas of Sonoma County north of Healdsburg
  - Removed obsolete references to the North Coast Rail Authority
  - Confirmed voters of Marin and Sonoma Counties are authorized to place a qualified voter initiative on the ballot
    - Provides voters opportunity to protect their investment
    - Initiative requires signature gathering to qualify
    - Requires majority vote to pass




# Average Weekday Ridership


September Average Weekday ridership: 3,659







## **SMART Ridership (Monthly)**






## **SMART Pathway Counts**

#### 24% higher than Sept 2023






- MTC conducted an onboard survey between Sept 2023 and Feb 2024
- The last survey was conducted in 2018
- Key findings:
  - More frequent riders 72% of passengers are riding frequently (at least once a week and up to 7 days a week) compared to 56% of riders in 2018
  - More youth riders Higher proportion (11%) of youth riders in 2023/2024, compared to 2018 (5%), which is consistent with trends we have seen with students on board.
  - Range of incomes:
    - o 32% of respondents have a Household income of less than \$60,000
      - Caltrain 22% / BART 42%
      - Qualifies family of four for Clipper Start (Reduced Fare Program)
    - Median income of respondents is \$110,000 per household
    - Over half of riders (58%)have a household income of less than \$150,000
  - Transit-Dependent riders 33% do not have access to a vehicle for their trip
  - Local riders 95% live in SF Bay Area, 5% visitors




#### Trip Purpose:

- 50% work commute
- 27% Recreation
- 14% School
- Employment status:
  - 55% employed full time
  - 14% students
  - 13% employed part-time
  - 8% retired
  - 2% unemployed
  - 8% blank/multiple responses
- Data gathered before the free fare program for youth and seniors





- Gender
  - 52% Male
  - 44% Female
  - 4% Other
- Age
  - Broad age distribution on SMART
  - Highest share age 35-44, 16%
- Language Spoken at Home
  - 81% English
  - 9% Spanish
  - 10% Multiple/other
- 5% of riders reported a disability that limits their ability to travel




#### Race/Ethnicity

- Respondents were asked to check all that apply
- Less than half the riders identified as white-only
- 21% Hispanic, Latino or Spanish origin
- 11% Asian
- 10% Native American
- 8% African American

 SMART Riders represent a range of ages, income levels, employment status, genders, trip purposes, and race/ethnicities.





## **Healdsburg Extension Update**

- September 2024
  - SMART Board awarded Healdsburg Project Cost Estimator (CoCoConsult) for Project Delivery cost estimating and procurement support
- October 2024
  - SMART Healdsburg Project inclusion Plan Bay Area 2050 Amendment recommended for approval by the committee to full MTC Commission for consideration on October 23<sup>rd</sup>
  - State of California will release Transit and Intercity Rail Capital Program Grant award announcement later this month
- November 2024
  - Caltrans and MTC submitting Solutions for Congested Corridors Program grant for SMART Extension to Healdsburg (Award - May/June 2025)
  - SMART submitting Local Partnership Program Competitive grant for SMART Extension to Healdsburg (Award – May/June 2025)
